Hull Rust Mine View

The World's Largest Open Pit Iron Ore Mine is located on the north edge of Hibbing. It is a landscape that has been more than 120 years in the making. Visitors can watch mining in action as they gaze out over a pit that stretches 3.5 miles long, 1.5 miles wide and reaches a depth of 535 feet! This pit now encompasses 50+ individual mines and 40+ separate properties. Since 1895, more than 800 million tons of iron ore have been removed. For more info, see hibbingmineview.org.

Mesabi Trail

The Mesabi Trail is a 10-foot wide bituminous surface built on a combination of old railroad beds, abandoned highway grades, old logging and mining roads, and blazing trail through the forest to get the next community. It stretches over 162 miles from the Mississippi River in Grand Rapids, to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness near Ely – with a few small gaps to be completed. A Wheel Pass is required by anyone 18 and older using wheels on the trail.
